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1. [Results of Business Operations and Financial Conditions]

(1) Summary of Business Operations

For the first six-month period of the fiscal year ending March 31, 2026, the Japanese economy continued to show signs of gradual recovery in an improving environment of employment and income.

We have continuously seen companies showing strong investment interests mainly in the field of digital transformation (DX) in the information services industry.

Investments in software products in the fiscal year under review are expected to increase compared with the previous fiscal year, according to the Tankan Survey by Bank of Japan (BOJ) in September.

On the other hand, in addition to the domestic economy facing downward risks under the effect of the U.S. trade policies, we are aware of risks of downward pressure exerted by continuing price increases upon the domestic personal consumption, eventually upon the entire economy in Japan.

Furthermore, it is necessary to be fully watchful about impacts from changes in the financial and capital market.

In this environment, we have been promoting efforts based upon the "Management Policies (2024-2026)" Note 1 with an eye on realizing the "Vision 2030" as we aim.

We have been working on the basic policies to: increase corporate value by establishing a sustainable business portfolio; optimize an allocation of management resources; and strengthen the Group's management base. At the same time, we are enhancing business through core businesses (the existing revenue sources) in tandem with growth businesses (the new foundations of revenue).

We have defined five focus areas in the core business: Financial, Retail, Energy, Mobility, OT Infrastructure Note 2 where we can utilize our excellent customer base and our thorough operational and customer knowledge.

In the Financial focus area among the focus areas, we have seen BankVision[®] full-banking system providing more banks with a public cloud-based services in an open environment.

We have been working on BankVision 2.0 with an eye on increasing furthermore value of BankVision. We released BankVision Service GW Plus and CXLinkage[®] in August 2025. The modules are conducive to improving the optimization and acceleration of BankVision system development through enabling BankVision to expose APIs furthermore easily and readily. The functions will enable banks to build an API economy and improve the productivity of system development as well as the convenience for customers through seamless coordination between the inside of them and external services. We will continuously work on initiatives to furthermore improve value of BankVision partly through using generative AI.

In the area of retail, we have seen strong sales of AIMSTAR[®], marketing AI SaaS developed and provided by GROWTH VERSE Co., Ltd. The Company entered into a capital and business tie-up with the provider in March 2025.

AIMSTAR will help retailers analyze data mainly about customer behaviors and purchase histories, and identify highly potential customers through the use of AI models. Retailers can expect to provide a comfortable and highly satisfactory shopping experience and at the same time maintain sales and improve profitability without compromising efforts for improving cost-effectiveness. We will continuously work on optimizing their communications with customers through full use of data and AI with an eye on providing services of higher quality.

We have set forth the three areas, Market Development, Business Development and Global Initiatives for growth businesses. This is in line with our aiming to establish new revenue bases and provide value.

In the market development, part of the three areas, we launched Data & AI Innovation Lab™ Note 3 in July 2025, a DX support solution conducive to companies attempting to accelerate business improvement cycles for a sustained business growth by embedding data and AI in business processes.

This solution serves customers through analyzing business issues and preparing improvement proposal plans with our consultants well-versed in their business sectors.

We help companies achieve a sustained business growth through accelerating business improvement cycles driven by AI embedded in businesses as indicated in scenario templates of each business sector.

The Company entered into a capital and business alliance with EAGLYS Inc. known for technologies of high-quality data development in August 2025.

The Company has embedded in Data & AI Innovation Lab the advanced data development technologies of EAGLYS Inc.'s that support AI agents development. As a result, Data & AI Innovation Lab enables a DX support that companies can transform knowledge and expertise accumulated in them into usable forms through AI for maximizing the use.

Our initiatives in the area of business development are exemplified by our working on a social implementation attempt of reproducing the experience offered at the Osaka Healthcare Pavillion of Expo 2025 Osaka, Kansai, in collaboration with a major railway company and a major advertising agency.

We plan to continuously avail ourselves of body measurement pods currently installed at railway station premises

through which we provide services of measuring health data mainly across areas: cardiovascular, musculoskeletal, hair, skin, and brain.

Also, we aim at deploying the services at office buildings and convenience stores as well as providing furthermore personalized experiences based upon combinations of healthcare data and behavioral data. Thus, we will continuously provide a scheme for having health data easily on a daily basis and receiving personalized healthcare services after the Expo 2025.

We have been promoting human resources strategy, technical strategy, investment strategy, and financial strategy, in collaboration with the business strategies as indicated in the Management Policies (2024-2026). We have been working on creating new value as well as proactively investing business resources in the areas of strength with an eye on strengthening market competitiveness.

We will evolve the value chains of our group in order to cope with changes in the circumstances at home and abroad and increase the value that we provide to customers.

For the first six months of the fiscal year ending March 31, 2026, customers continuously showed strong interest in IT investment. Revenue growth in services and product sales both remained strong. It amounted to \(\frac{4}{205}\),132 million, an increase of \(\frac{4}{19}\),100 million or 10.3% compared with the same period of the previous fiscal year.

Operating profit increased \(\frac{\pmathbf{3}}{3}\),404 million or 19.0% compared with the same period of the previous fiscal year to \(\frac{\pmathbf{2}}{2}\)1,350 million.

This was attributed to gross profit growth enabled based on the increase in revenue. It even absorbed an increase in the SG&A expenses ascribable to an increase in personnel costs and enhanced investments with an eye on future business increases.

(2) Summary of Financial Conditions

1 Summary of Assets, Liabilities and Equity

At the end of the first six-month period of the fiscal year under review, partly due to a decrease in trade receivables, total assets were \(\frac{\pma}{3}26,321\) million, a decrease of \(\frac{\pma}{4}4,554\) million compared with the end of the previous fiscal year.

Liabilities were ¥150,001 million, a ¥9,576 million decrease from the end of the previous fiscal year, partly due to a decrease in income taxes payable.

Equity was \(\frac{\pmathbf{176,320}}{176,320}\) million. Ratio of owners' equity to gross assets was 53.4%, up by 2.3 pts. from the end of the previous fiscal year.

2 Summary of Cash Flows

Cash and cash equivalents at the end of the first six-month period of the fiscal year under review were ¥54,330 million, a decrease of ¥10,470 million compared with the end of the previous fiscal year. The cash flow situations and relevant factors are stated below.

(Cash flows from operating activities)

Net cash provided by operating activities totaled \(\frac{1}{2}\) 20,668 million (an increase of \(\frac{1}{2}\)8,899 million in proceeds compared with the same period of the previous fiscal year).

This reflects proceeds of ¥21,634 million in profit before income taxes, the elements of increasing the proceeds and the elements of decreasing the proceeds.

The factors increasing proceeds include ¥9,049 million in depreciation and amortization, non-cash expenses, and a decrease of ¥11,699 million in trade and other receivables.

The factors decreasing the proceeds include an increase of ¥3,439 million in contract assets.

(Cash flows from investing activities)

Net cash used in investing activities was ¥12,552 million (an increase of ¥5,476 million in expenditures compared with the same period of the previous fiscal year).

This includes: expenditures of \(\pm\)2,088 million as a result of purchasing property, plant and equipment such as computers for business activities, expenditures of \(\pm\)7,492 million due to the acquisitions of intangible assets such as the investments in software for outsourcing, and expenditures of \(\pm\)2,182 million due to acquisitions of investment securities.

(Cash flows from financing activities)

Net cash used in the financing activities was \\ \pm 18,544 \text{ million} (a decrease of \\ \pm 4,285 \text{ million in expenditures from the same period of the previous fiscal year). This expenditure includes \\ \pm 4,632 \text{ million repayments for lease liabilities, purchase of treasury shares of \\ \pm 5,023 \text{ million and dividends payment of \\ \pm 5,895 \text{ million.}

(3) Comments on the Consolidated Earnings Forecasts and Other Forecasts

The Company revised the performance forecast on a consolidated basis announced on April 30, 2025 as indicated below, on the basis of the performance situations for the first six-month period of the fiscal year under review and the current environment around orders.

The reportable segments of the Company are those among the constituent units of the Company for which separate financial statements can be obtained and which are regularly examined by the Board of Directors for decisions on the allocation of management resources and for assessing business performance.

By fully harnessing the collective capabilities of the Group, the Company provides comprehensive IT solution services, from identifying customers' management issues to providing solutions to them.

The Company's operations therefore consist of segments composed of products and services that constitute our IT solution services.

We have five reportable segments: System Services, Support Services, Outsourcing, Software, and Hardware.

Details of the reportable segments are as follows:

- System Services: Software contract development business, system engineer services, and consulting
- Support Services: Software and hardware maintenance, installation support and related services
- Outsourcing: System operation by contract, and related services
- Software: Provision of software based on software license agreements
- Hardware: Provision of hardware partly based on equipment sales agreements
